

Planning For The Baby Boomers

The United States experienced the largest birth cohort ever born in the years of 1946 through 1964. Those born within these years have been identified as the “Baby Boomers”. In the year 2006, the Boomers began their retirement years. The projected 60+ population increase into our five-county area purports a 20% growth by the year 2010, and up to 30% by the year 2030.

While it is anticipated that the Boomers will not become a heavy demand on the overall service system until around the year 2030 (which is when the average age will be 75+), the time is ripe to begin the redesign of delivery systems, legislative efforts, housing planning, community program developments, and community education.
